Action for Self Reliance Organization (AFSR) works together with partner organizations Organization for Prevention, Rehabilitation and Re-integration Female Street children (OPRIFS) and Association for Sustainable Development Alternative (ASDA) on implementing Social Accountability projects in 1 woreda in Amhara (Adet), 1 woreda in Oromiya (Ziway Dugda), 2 woredas in the Southern Nations, Nationalities and Peoples Region (Malga, Hawassa) and 1 woreda in Addis Ababa City Administration (Arada).

With the \$298,560 grant the three partner organizations received, they are implementing Social Accountability projects in a period of two years that focus on the sectors of Agriculture, Education and Health that will benefit over 620,000 community members by better delivery of public basic services, improve efficiency of local governments and improve Social Accountability awareness of communities and local government officials.

The Social Accountability tools used by the three partner organizations to implement the projects are Community Score Card and Citizens' Report Card.

AFSR and its partner organizations are developing training manuals, recruit trainees, conducting workshops and organizing community sensitization and awareness sessions to increase the participation levels of the socially excluded segments of Ethiopian communities.

AFSR was established in 2000 and has designed various programs focused on children and women with an approach that centers on the family and the community. The three partner organizations have worked together for several years on projects focused on improving public service delivery through community engagement.
