

HUNDEE Oromo Grassroots Development Initiative

“To create a just world where women and men live in dignity and prosperity and to accompaniment of resource poor and marginalized communities in their own development to improve their livelihoods and ultimately attain economic and social transformation in Oromiya.”

HUNDEE Oromo Grassroots Development Initiative’s main objective is to strengthen the proactive dialogue between service providers and service users that improves the performance of public basic service delivery. HUNDEE’s approach is to improve the lives of marginalized communities through their own development.

With the \$287,194.02 grant, Social Accountability projects are implemented over the next two years in 5 woredas in the Oromiya region (Dandi, Jima Rare, Lume, Kuyyu, Welmera). HUNDEE and its partner organization GURMEE use the Social Accountability tools, Community Score Cards, Citizens’ Report Cards and Public Expenditure Tracking.

Partner organization GURMUU is involved with the socioeconomic development of women but also focuses on improving natural resources management and brings sustainable development to rural and peri-urban communities.

The projects implemented by HUNDEE and GURMEE are in the target sectors of Agriculture, Education, Health, Water and Sanitation and aim at giving fair representation to the marginalized and vulnerable groups by giving them the opportunity to have fair representation in the organized activities.

The direct beneficiaries of their projects are 104,165, while an additional 541,258 citizens will be indirectly positively affected.

Social Accountability tools and mechanisms are promoted by the two partner organizations through orientation workshops, capacity building trainings and interface meetings. This will lead to increased capacity of government officials and experts, institutionalization of Social Accountability tools and increased awareness of citizens of their entitlements to better quality basic services.

HUNDEE was established in 1995 and is experienced in enhancing livelihoods and promoting women’s human rights. Their core program areas are value chain development, community education, women empowerment and social service development programs.
