Union of Ethiopian Women Charitable Association (UEWCA) aims to expand accessibility and improve the quality of basic services through promoting the use of Social Accountability tools and approaches by citizens, local CSOs and government.

Union of Ethiopian Women Charitable Associations is working together over the next two years with their partner organizations Mothers and Children Multisectoral Development Organization (MCM-DO), Rohi Weddu Pastoral Women Development Organization and Marefia Children Center (MCC). Together they received a \$299,975.83 grant.

The Social Accountability projects of the four organizations focus on the target sectors of Education, Health, Rural Roads, Water and Sanitation. These projects are implemented in 2 woredas of Afar (Awash City, Amibara), 2 woredas in Oromiya (Arsi-Negelle, Meki) and 1 woreda in Addis Ababa City Administration (Akaki Kality).

Over 7500 service users will be able to apply Social Accountability tools such as the Citizens' Report Card and Community Score Card after the two-year projects. Additionally, 250 stakeholders will have participated in familiarization workshops and 200 service users will undertake capacity building trainings. This will result in increased quality delivery of public basic services and making the services more accountable, effective, efficient and accountable to the community at large.

Vulnerable groups such as women, children, elderly and the disabled are the main target group for the projects. They will be represented in the Social Accountability Committees where they can share ideas and provide feedback,

UEWCA was established in 2010 and is a consortium of 41 member organizations that are focused on improving the living standard of women and girls.
