

# WABE Children's Aid and Training

*"To see the lives of children from marginalized families and community groups improved."*

**W**ABE Children's Aid and Training (WCAT) projects are focused on empowering vulnerable and marginalized communities and citizens' groups and increase their demand for better quality public basic services by 60 per cent during the duration of the Social Accountability projects.

TWCAT and its partners Development Expertise Center (DEC) and Education For Development Association (EFDA) set specific targets for the projects they are undertaking for two years such as increasing basic service delivery by 50 per cent and raising awareness level of local government officials by 90 per cent.

With the \$251,313.53 grant that WCAT and its partners received, they are implementing Social Accountability projects in 2 woredas in Amhara (Nefas Mewcha, Debre Tabor), 1 woreda in Afar (Ayssaita) and 2 woredas in Oromiya (Jimma Horo, Kiltu Kara).

The Social Accountability tools of Community Score Card and Citizens' Report Card are used to implement the projects. The projects, that focus on the target sectors of Agriculture, Education, Rural Roads, Water and Sanitation, will directly benefit 45,000 people in communities and 750 woreda level government official service providers and staff.

WABE Children's Aid and Training has been working since 1993 to assist orphans and vulnerable children, to provide education opportunity for out of school children and to promote self-reliance and economic empowerment.
