

JOINT ACTIONS FOR PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT

Targeted facilities increased capacity and quality of service by adding more beds, more staff, more medicine, more electricity, better water & sanitation facilities, longer opening hours, friendlier service and sometimes even better access roads. As a result:

- Outpatient increase: 68.6% increase in 2 years, slightly better than national average
- Facility birth at least double with many clinics five and six-fold rises

- Behaviour change of health staff: more welcoming
 - Vulnerable groups gain better access to service
- Suboptimal drug purchasing systems addressed to overcome medicine shortages: procurement rules revised, catchment figures updated, budgets increased, health care financing effectively used
- Incorrect practices stopped, like paying for ambulance
- Waste disposal standards implemented


Construction / renovation - TB, additional rooms, generators (48)
