JOINT ACTIONS FOR PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT

Targeted facilities increased capacity and quality of service by adding more beds, more staff, more medicine, more electricity, better water & sanitation facilities, longer opening hours, friendlier service and sometimes even better access roads. As a result:

- + Outpatient increase: 68.6% increase in 2 years, slightly better than national average
- + Facility birth at least double – with many clinics five and six-fold rises

- + Behaviour change of health staff: more welcoming
- + Vulnerable groups gain better access to service
- + Suboptimal drug purchasing systems addressed to overcome medicine shortages: procurement rules revised, catchment figures updated, budgets increased, health care financing effectively used
- + Incorrect practices stopped, like paying for ambulance
- + Waste disposal standards implemented

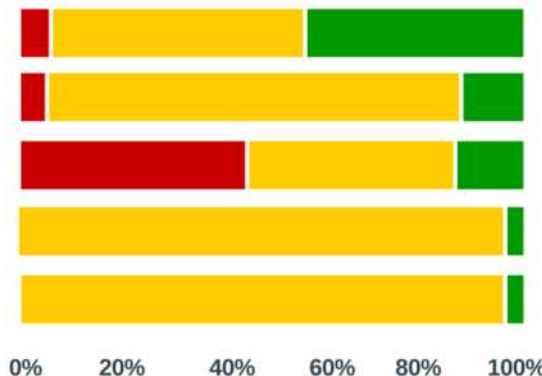
